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Course Overview

This international conference is targeted to healthcare providers working with survivors of childhood and adolescent cancer, including but not limited to, advanced practice providers, nurses, physicians, social workers, psychologists and school nurses. The conference offers a wide variety of topics related to all aspects of cancer survivorship. Opportunities for interactive learning and professional networking will augment the didactic components of the sessions.

Course Objectives

At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Explore how **AI (artificial intelligence)** and other emerging technologies can be incorporated into survivorship care
- Identify how **social determinants of health** such as socioeconomic status, access to healthcare, education, and the physical and social environment, can create disparities in long-term health outcomes and quality of life for childhood cancer survivors
- Identify treatment-associated risk factors for **late cardiac toxicity** in childhood cancer survivors and describe strategies for ongoing surveillance in this population
- Identify key genetic mutations that predispose individuals to the development of cancer and describe appropriate pathways for **genetic testing, counseling and tailored surveillance**
- Describe key concepts in survivorship care for patients treated with **CAR T-cell therapy**
- Describe how **radiation therapy** causes **late effects** in childhood cancer survivors and how advances in delivery techniques can mitigate some of the long-term complications of this treatment modality
- Improve understanding of other survivorship topics including **fertility/sexual health, transition to adult care, sleep and accelerated aging**
