WHO Essential Newborn Care (ENC) 1 Facilitator Course: Immediate Care & Helping Babies Breathe at Birth

Course Overview

ENC 1 is one of the modules of the new WHO Essential Newborn Care (ENC) Course, created by WHO in collaboration with the American Academy of Pediatrics. ENC 1, an updated version of Helping Babies Breathe (HBB), is an evidence-based, hands-on educational program to teach essential newborn care from birth to 60 minutes after birth, including neonatal resuscitation. For more information about the ENC course, visit: hmbs.org. This one-day course will provide participants with the skills necessary to train others in neonatal resuscitation.

Who Should Attend

This course is designed to develop new ENC 1 facilitator who will make a commitment to cascade the training to/with healthcare providers in low-resource settings. This course is suitable for doctors, nurses, midwives and allied health professionals.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- · Identify key messages of ENC 1
- Conduct all of the core ENC 1 skills (preparation for birth, routine care, the Golden Minute, continued ventilation, commit to making a difference) successfully
- Demonstrate mastery of bag and mask ventilation
- Complete the Knowledge Check and Case Scenarios successfully
- Demonstrate the ability to present ENC 1 content as facilitators
- Facilitate small group learning with participants of varying ability levels
- Access online resources to plan and evaluate courses

Registration and General Information

The conference will be held in the building on the Buerger Center for Advanced Pediatric Care on the main campus of Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch and syllabus material.

This is a condensed one-day ENC 1 course, and baseline knowledge in global health is expected. Participants are expected to review the ENC 1 curriculum and pass a multiple-choice knowledge exam prior to the start of the course.
