Participants will examine innovative ways to communicate science effectively, translate research into action, and champion equitable, child-centered solutions across global contexts. This gathering offers an inspiring forum for learning, connecting and collectively advancing progress in global child health.

- Understand how stories and advocacy shape funding priorities, public opinion and policy implementation

- Co-create narratives that advance global child health with the community, rather than extracting stories from it
