During this event, we will honor the legacy of Dr. Paul M. Weinberg, the first director of the Pediatric Cardiology Fellowship Program at CHOP. Over his 24 years in this role, he trained nearly 150 pediatric cardiologists and, throughout a remarkable 43-year career, became a foundational figure in pediatric cardiology at CHOP.

A master clinician, gifted educator, and renowned cardiac morphologist, Dr. Weinberg profoundly shaped generations of trainees through his one-on-one morphology teaching in the cardiac specimen registry, Thursday pathology lecture series, dissection conferences, clinic mentorship, and unwavering commitment to education. His influence continues to resonate through the many physicians, educators, and leaders he mentored.

Dr. Weinberg's enduring legacy will be reflected throughout this program and in the countless lives shaped by his teaching. We hope this event will both celebrate his extraordinary contributions and support the establishment of a fellowship educational fund in his name — a lasting tribute to his lifelong dedication to training future generations of pediatric cardiologists.

Course Objectives

- Apply strategies for translating bench research into bedside practice, with emphasis on innovation, evidence-based care, and quality improvement
- Discuss approaches to career development, mentorship, leadership, and academic advancement within pediatric cardiac specialties through reflection on training experiences and professional pathways

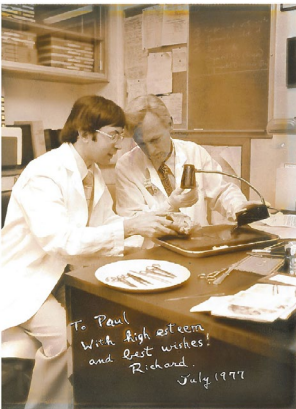
