Symposium on Integrative Health: Advances in Research and Evidence-based Practice

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OVERVIEW

Integrative healthcare is a patient-centered approach to healthcare that combines Western medicine with a broad range of therapeutic modalities drawn from healing traditions around the world. The evidence base for integrative medicine interventions is growing, and patients and families are increasingly using integrative modalities and expecting physicians to offer guidance on their use. This one-day symposium will offer healthcare practitioners a review of the evidence on common integrative modalities and their application to clinical practice.

The conference will be held in the Ruth and Tristram Colket, Jr. Translational Research Building at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee is \$125 (MD), \$60 (RD, RN, NP, fellows, residents and allied healthcare professionals), \$25 (students) and includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch, parking and syllabus material.
