

# **COURSE OVERVIEW**

Children's Hospital of Philadelphia proudly presents the 15th Annual Topics Explored: Pediatric Surgical and Trauma Nursing Conference. The format for this two-day program will be general lecture. The content options will be applicable to all levels of nursing expertise. Expert faculty will share the lessons they have learned from managing children who experience unexpected illness and traumatic injury. # GENERAL INFORMATION

The conference will be held Thursday, Nov. 16 and Friday, Nov. 17, 2017, at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Main Building, first floor, in the Stokes Auditorium. Registration will begin each day at 7:30 a.m. The registration fee for both days is \$199. The registration fee for one day is \$125.
