COURSE INFORMATION OVERVIEW

Interfacility transport of neonates and children requires advanced skills and knowledge among all members of the transport team. Positive outcomes can be achieved through communication and coordination between the referring and receiving care team, careful evaluation and management, anticipation of complications, and a safe, well-equipped and specially trained transport team. This one-day conference will provide a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to clinical issues related to neonatal and pediatric transport. Topics will include management of asthma, cardiac disease, airway emergencies, ventilation strategies and anaphylaxis. Case studies and simulation will give participants the opportunity to explore challenges and evidence-based care guidelines.

This course is intended for any member of the healthcare team involved in the stabilization and transport of neonates and children.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The conference will be held in the Ruth and Tristram Colket, Jr. Translational Research Building on the Raymond G. Perelman Campus at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee is \$125 and includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch, parking and syllabus material.

- Discuss current management strategies for stabilization and transport of neonates and children
- Demonstrate assessment and stabilization skills for the care of critically ill pediatric patients
