OVERVIEW

According to the Centers for Disease Control in March 2018, parent-reported information from the 2011-12 National Survey of Children's Health showed that one of seven U.S. children aged 2 to 8 years had a diagnosed mental, behavioral or developmental disorder. This conference will address some of the leading developmental and behavioral health concerns pediatricians and primary care providers deal with on a daily basis: autism, ADHD/learning challenges, anxiety, depression, weight management and school problems. Each lecture will include evidence-based treatments, medication management and resource suggestions, with the goal of providing attendees the most current best practices and practical tips for caring for patients with developmental or behavioral needs.
