COURSE OVERVIEW

This one-day course is designed to present the latest developments in research and clinical care for very-early-onset inflammatory bowel disease (VEO-IBD) and pediatric IBD. Participants will receive a comprehensive overview of the genomic, immunologic and microbiome discoveries in VEO-IBD and in pediatric IBD, epidemiologic trends, and of the advances in the diagnosis, medical and surgical management of the disease. This will include lectures by nationally and internationally recognized experts and interactive panel discussions, and case presentations from the audience.

This activity has been designed for gastroenterologists, gastrointestinal surgeons, GI fellows and residents, physician assistants, clinical nurse specialists, radiologists, pathologists, dieticians, and other healthcare professionals.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The conference will be held in Leonard and Madlyn Abramson Pediatric Research Center at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee is \$75 for physicians and \$50 for nurses and trainees and includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch, parking and syllabus material.

- Determine appropriate therapy for patients with VEO-IBD and pediatric IBD, considering both the patients phenotype and underlying genetics

- Discuss the management of difficult cases in VEO-IBD and pediatric IBD
- Discuss the role of surgery in pediatric IBD: how to determine optimal timing for intervention

- Explain how to counsel patients about the role of diet in disease development and as therapy for patients with IBD
