COURSE OVERVIEW

The Diabetes Center at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia is offering a course for nurses, caregivers and nonhealthcare professionals who provide care to children with diabetes. Participants may include nurses in schools, homecare settings, primary care offices and behavioral health settings. This workshop will also benefit school personnel, daycare staff, case managers and staff in child protective services.

This course is designed to provide a solid foundation in current diabetes management. Topics to be reviewed will include: treatment of type 1 and type 2 diabetes; self-care management principles; understanding and using diabetes technology (insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitoring systems) to improve outcomes; the emotional impact of diabetes diagnosis on families, and developmental milestones; and how to engage with children and families living with diabetes.
