OVERVIEW

Brain health is a priority across the lifespan and cognitive and mental health disorders can be among the most challenging medical problems to treat. This conference will focus on five common disorders of brain health — autism, attention deficit disorder, headache, depression and dementia. In each of these conditions, many patients remain symptomatic in spite of best efforts to treat them using an allopathic approach. Integrative modalities offer the potential for additional benefit and many patients are already using integrative modalities but there is a lack of widespread awareness of these modalities. The goal of this symposium is to educate clinicians on evidence-based integrative modalities for brain health. Lectures paired with moderated provider panel presentations will offer practical guidance on how to incorporate these modalities in the prevention, treatment and management of these common brain diseases.
