Course Overview

This one-day conference for hearing healthcare professionals will address the assessment and management of children with mild hearing loss. Presenters will share research, best practice guidelines and outcomes of patients with mild hearing loss. Case studies highlighting patients with mild hearing loss from diagnosis through hearing technology recommendations and aural rehabilitation will also be discussed.

General Information

The conference will be held in the Leonard and Madlyn Abramson Pediatric Research Center at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee is \$140 (professionals) or \$100 (full-time students) and includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch, parking and syllabus material.

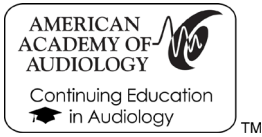

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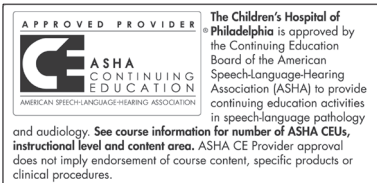
