### Course Overview

Over the past 18 months, as the world has grappled with COVID-19, children have largely been spared the direct impact of the disease. However, they have not escaped the indirect impact of the COVID-19 mitigation efforts and their implementation on their health and wellbeing. Data collected by UNICEF suggests that COVID-19 has pushed more families into poverty — an increase of about 140 million more children compared to 2019. Additionally, about 150 million more children went without access to education and health services, and 80 million children under age one likely missed out on life-saving vaccines. Now that vaccine roll-out has begun in several countries, and as mitigation efforts are lifted, there is work to be done to address these indirect effects. Our conference will feature child health, development and education experts who will share strategies to make sure we meet children's needs post-pandemic and help them catch up on the care and services they missed out on during the pandemic.

The 13th Annual CHOP Global Health Conference will explore how the COVID-19 pandemic has affected global child health and the deep concerns it has revealed. The pandemic has strained, and disrupted health systems in low-, middle-, and high-income countries, and children have often been the hidden victims. This conference will gather global health experts, interdisciplinary leaders from around the world, and youth to discuss the challenges that COVID-19 has imposed on children's health. We will also showcase strategies to mitigate its effects, and highlight successes and lessons learned as we look forward to a better post-pandemic world. Attendees will leave the conference with a clear mandate, objectives and strategies to make up for lost time in child health both globally and in their local health systems.
