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Course Overview

The all-new Current Concepts in Pediatric Advanced Practice Conference commences in 2022 which marks the 23rd anniversary of Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's Annual Advanced Practice Provider Conference and the second year of our all-virtual conference with content for APPs in a different roles — acute care, primary care and management. The conference offers a wide variety of topics related to all aspects of pediatric advanced practice including innovations in medical management and professional development strategies as well as leadership and topics for managers. Virtual opportunities for interactive learning and professional networking will augment the didactic components of the sessions.

The conference is targeted to nurses, advanced practice providers and physician colleagues in all practice areas throughout the spectrum of pediatric healthcare. Nursing and pharmacology contact hours will be provided by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation (ANCC). This program is not yet approved for AAPA CME credit. Conference organizers plan to apply for AAPA Category 1 CME credits from the AAPA Review Panel. The total number of approved credits is yet to be determined.

Paul Offit, MD is the Director of the Vaccine Education Center and professor of pediatrics in the Division of Infectious Diseases at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He is the Maurice R. Hilleman Professor of Vaccinology at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.

Daniela Brissett, MD is an adolescent medicine fellow in the Craig-Dalsimer Division of Adolescent Medicine at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She is also an LDI Fellow and works in the CHOP Policy Lab.

Mark Weber, RN, CRNP-AC is a Nurse Practitioner in the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the Program Manager for Vascular Access Initiatives in the Department of Anesthesiology and Critical Care Medicine.

Dorrie K. Fontaine, RN, PhD is the dean emerita and professor at the University of Virginia School of Nursing, retiring in 2020 after serving as dean for eleven years. Dorrie lectures widely on the importance of teaching resilience practices to nursing and medical students as well as clinicians and faculty to help create healthy work environments where all can flourish.
