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Course Information

This conference is intended for local and regional primary care physicians, psychologists, physician assistants, nurses, nurse practitioners, social workers, dietitians, and other healthcare providers specializing in pediatrics, family medicine, internal medicine, gynecology, and psychiatry. The program's aim is to increase the overall knowledge, understanding, and competencies of multidisciplinary providers in areas of importance in the healthcare of adolescents. The learning format will be in person and will include didactic lectures with interactive question-and-answer sessions and small group breakout sessions.

General Information

The conference will be held in the HUB for Clinical Collaboration at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. The registration fee is \$75 and includes continental breakfast, breaks, lunch, and syllabus material.

Course Objectives

1. Explain current evidence-based screening guidelines in adolescent health care and pragmatic implementation strategies in primary care
2. Increase health literacy in hot topics, such as sexual health, disordered eating, and opioid addiction
3. Review adolescent-focused physical exam techniques, including skin, abdomen, and genital components, using sensitive and trauma-informed practices
4. Demonstrate communication skills in delivering public health messages on topics related to adolescent health
