


Advances in Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine

CHOP HUB for Clinical Collaboration



Overview

This one-day program will provide neonatologists and neonatal healthcare providers with the most up-to-date information on a variety of complex physiologic issues in neonatology. Research and technology are constantly expanding. This program will review some of the latest therapies used in treating the sick neonate. Topics this year include in-utero gene editing, management of complex esophageal disorders, impact of the *Dobbs* decision on neonatal-perinatal medicine, team-based approach to optimizing resuscitation and neonatal management in the delivery room, collaborative approach to the management of perinatal HIV, and use of artificial intelligence in neonatology.
