Course Overview

The two-day symposium will focus on pediatric pulmonary vein stenosis (PVS) including the etiology, diagnosis, management, identification of knowledge gaps and current and future research efforts. Faculty with expertise in PVS from around the world will be invited to give presentations on selected topics as well as to participate in discussions throughout the symposium. The format will include traditional lecture-based, topic-focused sessions, case presentations and expert panels all with question-and-answer time built in to allow for vibrant discussion and participation from all attendees. The symposium is open to all medical providers and trainees interested in learning about PVS.

Course Objectives

- Understand the pathophysiology and diagnosis of PVS. Participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of the underlying mechanism, clinical presentation and diagnostic criteria of PVS.
- Explore current and emerging treatment strategies. Attendees will learn about the
 latest treatment options for PVS, including surgical interventions, catheter-based
 therapies, and pharmacological management. The objective is to equip medical
 providers with knowledge of both established and innovative approaches to improve
 patient outcomes.
- Enhance multidisciplinary care and patient management. The symposium will
 emphasize the importance of multidisciplinary approach in managing PVS.
 Participants will discuss case studies, collaborate on best practices, and develop
 strategies for coordinated care involving cardiologists, pulmonologists, radiologists,
 and other healthcare providers.




Cancellation and Refund Policy
