COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is directed toward primary care practitioners, including pediatricians, family practitioners, residents, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and allied healthcare providers. Participants will receive current information reviewing endocrinological disorders in neonates, children and adolescents, such as:

- · The approach to the child with obesity screening for complications and when to refer
- · Hypoglycemia
- Puberty menstrual cycle disorders
- Type 1 diabetes care outside of the Diabetes Center
- · Pediatric growth
- · Thyroid health
- · Favorite cases from primary care referral

This program will emphasize clinical pearls in handling common endocrine problems in areas of disorders of glucose, thyroid, lipids, puberty and genetic syndromes.

- Identify what testing should be done in the primary care office for hypoglycemia, and who needs an urgent referral for endocrine evaluation
- Review normal patterns of puberty, approaches to care of pubertal and adrenal abnormalities, and the capabilities of CHOP's Puberty and Adrenal Care team
- Explain what a typical day for kids and their families is like with type 1 diabetes: what is
 normal vs. what is worrisome; and review improvement efforts for type 1 diabetes care at
 CHOP and globally
- Identify normal pediatric growth patterns, identify abnormal growth patterns, review treatment options and their efficacy, and discuss common diagnoses related to abnormal growth profiles

- Review methods for congenital hypothyroidism screening and care of pediatric thyroid disease; including common pitfalls, new emerging treatments and pediatric thyroid cancer outcomes
- · Discuss follow-up from complicated and interesting primary care referrals to the endocrine clinic
