COURSE OVERVIEW

While people may disagree about the causes, it is undeniable that shifts in temperature and weather, i.e., climate change, is impacting lives and livelihoods worldwide. Wildfires, droughts, air pollution, extreme flooding, and higher-than-normal temperatures are being experienced all over the globe. Children are a vulnerable population because of their unique physiology and dependence on adults for their well-being. They are not only bearing the brunt of these shifts today but will also live with the harmful consequences of climate change in the future. This year's 16th Annual CHOP Pediatric Global Health Conference, "Rising Up Together: Child Health in the Face of Climate Change," will explore short- and long-term interventions to help mitigate the impact of climate change on child health.

GHEARD is a modular curriculum for global health trainees and providers, published by the American Academy of Pediatrics in collaboration with the Association of Pediatric Program Directors and the Consortium of Universities for Global Health. It was created by a diverse group of authors with representatives from across the education spectrum and around the world. GHEARD seeks to prompt critical reflection and facilitate important conversations within global health training spaces around inequity, racism, systems of oppression, and the legacies of colonialism and neocolonialism within global health. The hope is that by discussing and reflecting on these important topics, global health practitioners will be more aware of their power and positionality, inclined to center the voices of expert colleagues in resource-constrained communities, and empowered to work towards a more equitable, decolonized field of global health.
