COURSE OVERVIEW

Global health as a discipline prioritizes quality healthcare and health equity for all people worldwide. According to the World Health Organization, at least 50 percent of the world's population is still unable to access essential health services. Without these services, children risk illness and delays that prevent them from realizing their full potential.

The education of health providers is key to improving child health. True bi-directional global child health partnerships that include a focus on capacity building in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) can help to ensure that LMIC healthcare providers have the skills they need to be excellent practitioners, leaders, researchers and child advocates in their countries.

The 2018 CHOP Global Health Conference will explore ways to optimize sustainable, innovative and high-impact education in global LMIC settings, and to use effective education as a tool to achieve health equity for people, especially children, worldwide. Attendees will gain tools to be better partners, colleagues, educators, learners, clinicians, researchers and advocates in global health contexts. Educational stories from around the world, keynotes, panels, discussions, interactive meals and oral poster presentations will challenge each of us to be more effective educators in global settings.
