LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this two-day course, participants will be able to:

- Identify challenges that face healthcare team members caring for this pediatric patient population
- Review current treatment and technologic advances relevant to the care of children with surgical and trauma related needs
- Discuss current research trends that have impacted pediatric trauma care; review goals for healthy children worldwide and the challenges faced in caring for children with surgical and trauma needs in austere environments; describe the medical examiner's role in trauma care; review approaches to hip preservation for teens and young adults; discuss evaluation and treatment of blunt abdominal trauma; review conditions requiring craniofacial surgery and follow-up care; recognize current management for sports injuries; examine approaches to evaluating nonaccidental trauma; describe interventions for ocular trauma and the cornerstones for the successful management of a child with bladder exstrophy.
