OVERVIEW

Multidisciplinary educational conference focusing on lymphatic involvement in systematic disease, including, but not limited to, specialists from cardiology, lymphatics, neonatology, critical care/anesthesia, interventional radiology, gastroenterology, radiology, comprehensive vascular anomalies, cardiothoracic surgery and general surgery. Attendees will engage in knowledge sharing, including research and innovative therapies, and novel treatments for patients with lymphatic dysfunction.
